Minute for Mission Celebrate the Gifts of Women Presbyterians were divided over the institution of slavery in the decades leading up to the Civil War. Southern Presbyterian churches finally withdrew from the national assembly and created their own assembly in 1861. It was not until 1983 that The Presbyterian Church (USA) was created by the reunion of the United Presbyterian Church in the Unites States (UPCUSA), the "Northern Presbyterian Church" and the Presbyterian Church in the United States (PCUS), the "Southern Presbyterian Church." The women we celebrate today represent "firsts" in all three denominations.

Millicent Fauntleroy Davie Street Presbyterian Women Rev. Katie Geneva Canon, the first African American woman ordained as a teaching elder in the Presbyterian Church (UPCUSA) in 1974

Thelma C. Adair, the first African American woman Moderator of the Presbyterian Church (UPCUSA), elected by the 188th General Assembly in Baltimore, Maryland in 1976 **Sarah Bell-Lucas,** first African-American Moderator of New Hope Presbyterian Women.

Catherine Meynardie, Sally Owens & Beth Harris West Raleigh Presbyterian Women

Rev. Rebecca Reyes, the first Hispanic woman to be ordained in the Presbyterian Church (PCUS) in 1979.

Rev. Dr. Isabel Wood Rogers, the first woman to serve as Moderator of the reunified Presbyterian Church (USA), elected by the 199th General Assembly in Biloxi, Mississippi in 1987.

Rev. Katie Ricks, the first openly gay woman to be ordained in the Presbyterian Church (USA) on April 15, 2012.`

Leorita Barker Hankerson



Leorita Barker Hankerson is the only child of the late Edgar Leo and Edna Barker. She was born in a segregated hospital that was named after her great grandmother in Fort Myers, Florida. Leorita weighed in at three pounds and was set aside as a still born baby. An angel of a nurse discovered otherwise and she's been kicking ever since.

She graduated Valedictorian of her class from Campbell Street High School in Daytona Beach, Florida. Leorita attended Talladega College, in Talladega, Alabama, graduating with a Bachelor of Arts in Elementary Education with a minor in Voice. She received a Master of Arts in School Administration from Teachers College, Columbia University in New York City.

Her work experience is diversified. She taught one year in Fort Myers, Florida in the same school where her father was a past principal and her mother was the choral director. After marriage to Roland S. Hankerson, Sr., Leorita moved to Staten Island, New York. While in New York, she worked for Solomon Brothers in the Trading Room for three years.

After graduate school, Leorita taught preschool and was the Director of Whitney Young Day Care Center on Staten Island. After a move to Charleston, South Carolina, Leorita taught second grade and music for seven years before moving to Rocky Mount, North Carolina in 1980.

She served as an Assistant Principal, Principal, Director of Personnel and Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum and Instruction for Nash Rocky Mount Schools. She retired but was called back to help open and become principal at the system's first Alternative School until they could find someone. She was there for five years! After mentoring beginning teachers and principals, she finally said "Good Bye!"

Leorita has served as a member of the Board of Directors at Southern Bank and Nash UNC Hospital. She is a dedicated member of Mount Pisgah Presbyterian Church where she serves as Clerk of Session and Director of Music. In 2014, she was elected Moderator of New Hope Presbytery and served as a delegate to the 222nd General Assembly in Portland, Oregon. She has worked diligently on numerous New Hope Presbyterian Committees. She is also a member of the Rocky Mount Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., the Wilson Rocky Mount – Tarboro Chapter of LINKS, Inc. and the Rocky Mount MOLES where she serves in many capacities.

Leorita is the proud mother of Roland Jr. and Lea Jacquelyn. She is even prouder of Alaya Janeé, Amani Mariah, Joshua Miles, and Aydan Saigon who are her grandchildren. In fact, Leorita says her greatest accomplishment is being mother to Roland and Lea and "Nana" to her grandchildren.
