Reverend Dr. David C. Forbes, Sr.

Biography



Rev. Dr. David C. Forbes Sr. has lived a life marked by activism and leadership. Growing up in Raleigh, North Carolina, just five blocks from Shaw University, Forbes was one of eight children in a close-knit community. His father, a minister, and his mother, a devout woman, instilled in him a strong sense of purpose and the belief that everyone is a creation of God with a duty to make the world a better place.

Forbes attended Shaw University, where he quickly emerged as a leader. He was

elected freshman class president and, in 1960, became a key figure in the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) under the guidance of Ella Baker. He led sit-ins and demonstrations, becoming the first protester arrested in Raleigh for civil disobedience. His leadership and organizational skills ensured that the movement ran smoothly, with various committees in place to manage logistics, education, finance, and legal matters.

Throughout his life, Forbes remained committed to activism and education. He earned a Master of Social Work from Adelphi University and a Doctor of Ministry from United Theological Seminary. Forbes worked as a public-school teacher and outreach worker in New York City before returning to Raleigh in the early 1980s.

In Raleigh, he continued his work for social justice, founding the Lost Generation Task Force to support young men at risk of entering the school-to-prison pipeline. He also served as a minister at Christian Faith Baptist Church and joined the Board of Trustees at Shaw University. Forbes' dedication to civil rights and social change has left a lasting impact on his community and beyond, highlighting the ongoing need for equality and justice for all citizens.
